## **MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION TIPS\***

All medication orders must be verified prior to administration

### **6 RIGHTS OF MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION**

#### 1. Resident:

- a. Use **2 identifiers** (Name, date of birth, picture, wristband)
- b. Must attempt to verify ID regardless of resident's ability to participate
- 2. Medication: Medication must match prescribed order
- **3. Dose:** Dosage must match the order, and the order must be at a safe dosage level
- 4. Route: PO, IM, IV, must be appropriate for the medication and the resident
- **5. Time:** Must adhere to the prescribed frequency and time of administration
- 6. Documentation: Document administration and all necessary information

- New admission orders and new orders for existing residents are processed on the weekend.
- Refills are not routinely filled on the weekend. They are filled Monday morning.

### **State Regulation Regarding Medication Errors**

F760: The facility must ensure that its— §483.45(f)(2) Residents are free of any significant medication errors. DEFINITIONS

"Medication Error" means the observed or identified preparation or administration of medications or biologicals which is not in accordance with:

- 1. The prescriber's order;
- 2. Manufacturer's specifications (not recommendations) regarding the preparation and administration of the medication or biological; or
- 3. Accepted professional standards and principles which apply to professionals providing services. Accepted professional standards and principles include the various practice regulations in each State, and current commonly accepted health standards established by national organizations, boards, and councils.

	<ul> <li>Make sure head of bed is elevated at 30-45 degrees prior to med</li> </ul>

	Do not leave medications at bedside
	<ul> <li>Insulin vial or pen must have <u>resident specific</u> pharmacy label affixed</li> </ul>
	• Insulin pens must be <b>primed with 2 units</b> prior to administering dose
Injected	Hold insulin pen to skin until 10 seconds after dial reads o
Medications	<ul> <li>IM/SQ injection sites are rotated and documented</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Label all mixed IV bags PRIOR TO administering</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Injections site must be documented after administration</li> </ul>
Medications	<ul> <li>Confirm G-tube placement prior to administering medication via</li> </ul>
administered	auscultation
via	<ul> <li>Check residual volume (Aspirate tube prior to giving medication or feeding)</li> </ul>
gastrostomy	<ul> <li>Crush all medication and place in separate pill cups to administer</li> </ul>
tube	separately
	<ul><li>Mixing crushed medications requires an "ok to cocktail medications"</li></ul>

	<ul> <li>Make sure head of bed is elevated at 30-45 degrees prior to med</li> </ul>
	administration
	• <b>Flush tube</b> with warm water prior to administration, between each
	medication, and after completion of medication administration (15-30 mL or
	prescribed amount)
Topical	<ul> <li>ROTATE and DOCUMENT SITES of transdermal patches</li> </ul>
Medications	Order CANNOT read "administer to affected area"
Eye Drops	<ul> <li>Allow 3-5 minute spacing between administration of differing eye drops</li> </ul>
	Gloves must be worn
Inhaled	Shake inhaler gently prior to administration
Medications	• 1 minute spacing between puffs of <b>same</b> inhaler, 2 minutes spacing between
	puffs of <b>differing</b> inhalers
